Feel free to come by the library and find a table, computer, or comfy sofa to study at, but don't forget to first go sign in and talk to the math tutor, Ms. Patty Short. Her office is located in room 572 (past the computers, toward the back of the library).

Tutoring is not about just getting the homework done. It involves a process to help you truly understand the material based on definitions, theories, and logical reasoning.

The process of a tutoring session:

- The tutor will evaluate your math skills/knowledge by looking at an attempted problem with detailed steps.
- The tutor will assess the skills that need to be stronger.
- The problem will then be reworked (as long as it is not a graded assignment) by the tutor with detailed, in-depth steps, and (handwritten and verbal) explanations.
- Once you understand the mathematical steps, you are encouraged to write generic steps in your own words that can be applied to other problems within that section.
- Another problem will be given to work on your own to retain the lesson.

IMPORTANT: Students are required to do all graded assignments solely on their own.

Math tutoring can also help you with:

- Study skills
- Organizing notes
- Learning to read math books
- Test taking skills
