HOW TO APPLY: *Applicants to North Georgia College & State University must submit the following:*

1. ___ A properly completed and signed Application for Undergraduate Admission. With a \$30 non-refundable application fee.
2. ___ A completed North Georgia Immunization Certificate, located at www.forms.ngcsu.edu is not needed to make an admissions decision but will be required before starting classes.
3. ___ In addition, the following documents are required by the application deadline for consideration for admission:

FRESHMAN: *Graduated from high school within the past five years and has less than 30 semester hours (45 quarter hours) of transferable college credit*

1. ___ Student should request an official high school transcript be sent by their appropriate school official to the Undergraduate Admissions Office.
2. ___ Student should request official SAT or ACT scores to be sent by their counselor, CollegeBoard or ACT. A minimum 480 SAT Critical Reading (or 20 ACT English) and 440 SAT Math (or 18 ACT Math) is required for regular admission.
3. ___ Freshmen who have attended college should request an official transcript be sent directly to the Undergraduate Admissions Office from EACH college attended. Transferring freshmen should refer to www.admissions.ngcsu.edu for eligibility requirements.

NON-TRADITIONAL FRESHMAN: *Has not attended high school within the past five years, whose high school class graduated at least five years ago, holds a high school diploma or GED, and has earned fewer than 30 transferable semester hours of college credit*

1. ___ Submit an official high school transcript and official college transcript(s), if applicable. Official SAT or ACT scores are not required.

TRANSFER (OR POST-BACCALAUREATE, Second Bachelor's Degree): *Has 30 or more semester hours (45 quarter hours) of transferable college credit*

1. ___ Students should request official transcripts be sent directly to the NGCSU Office of Undergraduate Admissions from EACH college attended.
2. ___ Students wishing to pursue a degree in education or nursing MUST contact the appropriate department immediately to receive instructions for application and admission to each respective program. This requirement is in addition to this general North Georgia application.

Note: Research has shown that a greater rate of success is achieved by students who attempt the Regents Test immediately after completing freshman English. You are encouraged to attempt the Regents Test as soon after your freshman English as possible.

TRANSIENT: *An applicant who is enrolled in another college or university and meets minimum North Georgia College & State University freshman or transfer admission requirements may seek temporary admission to North Georgia. Transient students must re-apply each semester.*

1. ___ Students should request a letter be sent directly to the NGCSU Office of Undergraduate Admissions from the registrar of the institution in which the student is regularly enrolled, indicating good standing and recommending admission to North Georgia as a transient student. Transcripts of college work completed elsewhere are not required of transient students.

FORMER STUDENT RETURNING: *An applicant who was last enrolled at North Georgia and wishes to return.*

1. ___ Submit official transcripts from all other accredited colleges and universities attended since you were last enrolled at North Georgia.

JOINT ENROLLED: *An academically qualified high school applicant who wishes to take North Georgia courses during the junior or senior year*

1. ___ Submit an official high school transcript, official SAT-I or ACT scores, and an official copy of your class schedule.
2. ___ A counselor recommendation is required unless participating in the ACCEL program.
3. ___ Written permission from the applicant's parent(s) is required unless participating in the ACCEL program.

NON-DEGREE: *A high school graduate who wishes to take classes and is not pursuing a degree*

1. ___ Submit an official high school transcript showing a graduation date. A maximum of 13 semester hours may be taken under this classification.

POST-BACCALAUREATE, NON-DEGREE: *An applicant who has received a bachelor's degree and does not wish to pursue a second bachelor's degree*

1. ___ Submit an official transcript from the degree-granting institution verifying the awarding of a bachelor's degree. Applicants seeking teacher certification should contact North Georgia's Department of Teacher Education at 706-864-1533 prior to submitting this application.

AMENDMENT 23: *An applicant 62 years of age or older who is a Georgia resident AND wishes to enroll in classes without payment of fees, except for the application fee, supplies, laboratory fees and shop fees*

1. ___ Applicants who wish to pursue a bachelor's degree must also submit all items in the "Transfer" section above.

Freshman applicants must:

1. Be at least 16 years old on or before the registration date.
2. Have graduated from an accredited high school or a high school that is approved by the University.
3. Present credit for the following 16 CPC (College-Preparatory Curriculum) units:
 - **Four** CPC units of English which have as their emphasis grammar and usage, literature (American, English, or world), and advanced composition skills.
 - **Four** CPC units of mathematics. Specifically, Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2, and an additional mathematics course that has these courses as prerequisites.
 - **Three** CPC units of science, with at least one laboratory course from the life sciences and one laboratory course from the physical sciences.
 - **Three** CPC units of social science, with at least one course focusing on United States studies and one course on world studies.
 - **Two** CPC units in the same foreign language emphasizing speaking, listening, reading, and writing.
4. Have satisfactorily completed the SAT-I or the ACT and any other entrance examination required by the University, with an acceptable score.

Admission to North Georgia College & State University is a selective process and meeting minimum admission requirements will not necessarily guarantee acceptance. Typically, over 2,000 applications are submitted for approximately 650 freshman openings for the fall semester. The average SAT-I score (Critical Reading and Math) for recently enrolled freshmen was 1083 and average high school College-Preparatory Curriculum GPA was 3.31.

If you have been home-schooled or have graduated from a non-accredited high school, please visit our website for additional admission requirements. Admission to North Georgia as an undergraduate student does not automatically admit the individual to teacher education or nursing programs.

Transfer applicants must:

1. Have attended other colleges and maintained a transferable grade point average of 2.0 or better, have a clear conduct record, are in good academic standing and are eligible to return to their former college. All official transcripts must be provided from the colleges.
2. Meet freshman admission criterion if the transfer applicants have not completed at least 30 semester hours of transferable credit.
3. Have successfully completed the following 12 credits if the applicant's transferable college GPA is lower than 3.0:
 - A course that is the equivalent to North Georgia's ENGL 1101 (English Composition I), with a grade of "C" or better;
 - A mathematics course that is the equivalent of North Georgia's MATH 1101 (Introduction to Mathematical Models), MATH 1111 (College Algebra), MATH 1113 (Pre-calculus) or MATH 2450 (Calculus I);
 - Two additional courses (six semester hours) from the Core Curriculum (refer to the university's Undergraduate Bulletin at <http://www.ngcsu.edu/academic/Catalog/index.shtml>).

Deadlines

For Fall Semester admission, if you plan to live on campus, you are encouraged to submit your application materials by the preferred date of January 1. If you plan to live off campus, you are encouraged to submit your application materials by the preferred date of March 1. The fall semester deadline is July 1. The spring semester deadline is November 15. The summer semester deadline is April 1.

NORTH GEORGIA'S RESIDENCE POLICY

North Georgia's Residence Policy for Non-Cadet Students

Full-time students who have not earned 60 semester hours must live on campus. Students may live off-campus if they:

- live with and commute daily from the permanent legal residence of their parent(s) or grandparent(s) within a fifty-mile radius of campus
- are married or divorced
- are 21 years of age or older
- have completed two years of successful active military service

A waiver of this policy will be considered in individual cases for unique hardships. Prospective students should submit requests to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions.

North Georgia Corps of Cadets Participation Policy

The Corps of Cadets is a residential leadership experience which requires all cadets to live in a student-led military environment. Therefore, students in the Corps of Cadets must be enrolled full time and live on campus in designated residence halls. Cadets may live off-campus if they reside at the permanent legal residence of parent(s) or grandparent(s) within Dawson, Hall, Lumpkin, or White counties; are married; are 23 years of age or older; or have completed two years of successful active military service.

Cadets who have earned 90 semester hours may elect to leave the Corps to become civilian students. Those who leave the Corps prior to earning 90 semester hours will be ineligible to enroll in North Georgia courses for a period of one calendar year from the date of their withdrawal from the Corps.

The Office of the Commandant may consider waivers of this policy in individual cases. Prospective cadets should submit requests to the Cadet Recruitment Center, enrolled cadets to the Commandant.

Failure to comply with these policies may result in dismissal from the university. Failure to comply is defined as an act of providing misleading or false information during the admissions process or when applying for a waiver; or not moving into or maintaining residence in university housing when available.

Confirmation Deposit

Students admitted for the Fall semester are required to pay a \$200 Confirmation Deposit by May 1, or if admitted after May 1, within two weeks of admission. Students admitted for the Spring semester are required to pay a \$200 Confirmation Deposit by December 1. The Confirmation Deposit will be refunded to the enrolled student no sooner than 10 days after the start of classes. Admitted students who do not enroll will not receive a refund of their Confirmation Deposit.

Housing Deposit

In addition to the \$200 Confirmation Deposit, all resident students admitted are required to pay a \$250 Housing Deposit by the deadline indicated in the letter of acceptance.
